The celebration took place on May 13th; the anniversary date of the Mule Train leaving Marks, Mississippi, headed to Atlanta, Georgia, fifty-three years ago. Scores of out of town guests and local residents came to witness this occasion; which is featured in this pictorial news story.

Interpretive Trail and read, touch and explore the content of each marker. These markers signify the locations and places where Dr. King, members of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), noted celebrities, Freedom Riders, and hundreds of civil rights community organizers, as well as scores of local leaders and residents emerged; creating this civil rights history, which is now documented and artistically displayed on the eleven interpretive markers.
